**Eduardo Delgado Rodríguez.** Born in the City of Havana in 1955, white. Brigadier General, Chief of the General Directorate of Intelligence (*Dirección General de Inteligencia*, DGI) since 1994, having replaced Division General Jesús Bermúdez Cutiño.

Perceived as talented, highly dedicated, and honest, he comes from an urban lower middle class family. Active in the revolutionary process, his mother worked at the DGI archives for many years. A *Camilito* cadet school student and junior officer by the mid 1970s, he was assigned to military Counter Intelligence. He studied law and achieved the rank of major by the late 1980s. Stationed in Angola in the early 1980s. Chief investigator in the Ochoa-La Guardia case in 1989. Transferred to MININT under Colomé Ibarra and Fernández Gondín.
