Juan Contino Aslán. Born in the 1960s, raised in the city of Havana, white. He has a Master's degree in Economics. He is President of the People's Power Provincial Assembly of the City of Havana, a member of the Central Committee of the Cuban Communist Party, *diputado* to the National Assembly, and a member of the Council of State. A potential candidate for the Politburo.

Following a political crisis within the Party in 2003 and the removal of Conrado C. Martínez Corona as President of the People's Power Provincial Assembly of the City of Havana, Contino was called to take over that position. For almost a decade until then he had been in charge (*Coordinador Nacional*) of the CDRs. Prior to this, he had been second and first secretary of the Communist Youth (UJC) from the 1980s until 1995, replacing Robaina in 1993. Close to Raúl Castro who supported him against Roberto Robaina when the latter was the first secretary of the Communist Youth (UJC). He was in Angola from 1989 till 1990. In the late 1970s and early 1980s, he was in charge of the "José Martí" Pioneers Organization (*Organización de Pioneros "José Martí"*).
